Neville Reyner, President of the BCC, said:

“The Chamber Awards are a widely regarded as a highlight in the business calendar nationally and regionally and rightly so. Every year the Awards inspire us all with the quality and strength of Britain’s best businesses. The winners represent the pinnacle of achievement in business. They serve to inspire those of us that have been in business for years and those embarking on the adventure of setting up their own company.”

Each of the regional winners receives a certificate and they will all now go through to the national round of judging and the chance to win the top prize of £50,000 courtesy of Royal Bank of Scotland. This prize will be awarded to the company that the judges agree should win the overall Award for Outstanding Business Achievement. Last year this was won by Tyrrells Potato Chips Ltd. The judges remarked on the way the company approached the green issue in such an ambitious way. They introduced reed beds for waste water and extensive recycling and energy reduction measures. They have also provided nesting for wildlife on their land. Tyrrells has its own production of organic potatoes and rapeseed oil, and has therefore reduced its transport needs.
